Co-Curricular

The Co-curricular programme at Moreton Hall is designed to compliment the academic curriculum as well as providing opportunities for pupils to develop new skills and talents.

A vast range of activities is offered and is reviewed each term by the Assistant Principal Cocurricular thus ensuring a vibrant, balanced and organic range of activities that reflect pupil interests and truly enrich beyond the classroom. The Activity programme is made up of five segments: #MoretonContributes, #MoretonCreates, #MoretonDiscovers, #MoretonExplores and #MoretonLeads.

Divisions

Moreton Enterprises is a unique business venture which was established at the school 30 years ago.

Our Enterprises Centre houses retail outlets (Tuck, Boost and Elements) selling a range of stationery, everyday toiletry products, gifts, smoothies and occasional sweet treats. Music Making

Tuition

Tuition can be arranged in all orchestral instruments as well as percussion, piano, guitar, harp and singing. We also offer individual or group Music Theory lessons and aural and musicianship lessons. Pupils have the chance to have a free trial lesson, on the instrument of their choice.

Music examinations are encouraged, but are certainly not compulsory. All examination syllabuses and boards are explored by pupils (e.g. ABRSM, Trinity and London College), including the new Performance and Digital Grade. It is worth noting that successful Grade 6, 7 and 8 pupils gain valuable UCAS (University & College Admission Service) points that will support their application to further education.

Pastoral

As Moreton is still a relatively small school, there is a family atmosphere and outstanding pastoral support. The pupils are in a happy, busy, nurturing environment with their friends and with caring adults 24 hours a day.

Personal Devices

Pupils may bring personal wireless devices including Smartphones, a Laptop/Chromebook and Tablet computers to school for educational purposes. Responsibility to keep the device secure rests with the pupil. It is recommended that protective cases are used and devices can be physically easily identifiable. Each house has their own policy for the use of these devices and they will be able to advise further on contact.

Prefects

School Prefects and Head of House are appointed by the Principal at the end of the Spring term in the Lower Sixth year. Prefects have a range of responsibilities and are ambassadors for the school. The Head Prefect and Deputies are selected from the Prefect body.

All Upper Sixth students will have an opportunity to take on a role of responsibility in the their final year.

Pupil Complaints Procedures

If a pupil believes that sanctions have been imposed unfairly or if they have any other cause for complaint, then they should seek advice from an adult in school whom they think can help them. Many pupils in the Senior School are enrolled in a continuous programme throughout the school to support their confidence and ability to effectively engage in public speaking. Spoken English is taught in small groups of 3 – 4 pupils. In Lower Sixth all students have lessons in Spoken English leading to their Grade 8 assessment in Speech which develops effective communication skills and confidence. This award also provides valuable UCAS points for university entrance.

In addition to E.S.B. work, they can participate in Speech and Drama Festivals as well as Public Speaking and Debating competitions. This gives all pupils the opportunity to build confidence in presentation skills.

Note

Start of term date indicates the day on which boarders return. Day pupils return the following day in time for registration. Pupils are not expected to return to school more than 2 hours before the published start time without prior agreement with the Houseparent. All dates more than two terms in advance are provisional.

Tutorials

Every pupil has a Tutor who oversees their academic and pastoral progress. Tutees meet with their Tutor on a Tuesday and Thursday at 8:25am; they also have a one-to-one tutorial during the week. The Tutor works closely with the Houseparent and is also another point of contact for parents.

Uniform and Sixth Form Dress Code

The uniform aims to be smart, comfortable and practical whilst providing the pupils with a sense of identity. Sixth Formers have a dress code but no set uniform. Virtual Learning

The school uses Firefly as its Virtual Learning Environment which is full of resources supporting all subjects, as well as careers information, policies and advice for pupils. All prep is set on Firefly in the Senior School, which can be accessed via a website and an app so you can easily keep a track of your work and resources to support you. Parents also use Firefly for resources to support their children, and to access reports and assessments.

Weekend Activities

'A' and 'B' Weekends

You will see reference made to 'A' and 'B' Weekends throughout the School Calendar, Weekend Activities Booklet and also on the timetable. This relates to the school timetable and the lessons to attend on that particular weekend.

Whilst we do not wish to lose our flexibility, we do feel that to get the best out of Moreton it is essential for pupils to join in as many weekend activities as possible.



Weekend Leaves

Pupils must give their Houseparent due notification of their leave requests as specified in each house.

Shopping leaves, from Lower Five upwards are at the discretion of the Houseparent and pupils must travel in groups. Written permission from parents/guardians is required for any leave involving travel on public transport alone, after dark, or an overnight stay, shopping trips with friends etc.

Wellbeing

Wellbeing is promoted through many areas of Moreton life such as:

Wellbeing Wednesday: when our assembly and house activities reflect important themes on wellbeing. We have introduced sessions of mindfulness and meditation as part of our assembly programme.

Talk to Talk sessions are provided by our Nurses and provide an opportunity for pupils to drop in and talk about any issues affecting them.

We run a varied programme of pastoral talks for parents and workshops for students from visiting speakers. Our themes have included screen free days, healthy eating and having a positive body image.

Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHEE).

Life Skills: an essential part of the all round education at Moreton Hall. Sixth Form students have a formal programme of seminars, discussion groups and practical sessions aimed at preparing students for life after school. Important themes include resilience, managing stress, self defence and healthy relationships.

Of course Moreton Hall, like all schools, offers a broad and varied curriculum - Academic subjects, Sport for All, Art, Music and Drama - yet it is the personal, nurturing and supportive approach of all our staff members which truly enhances our pupils' wellbeing.
